

# Quantitative research for social work

14 December 2015, Manchester

This seminar will showcase UK quantitative research on social work and explore the use of diverse quantitative designs in studies of social work and social care. The day will be structured around keynote presentations on quantitative study designs and data sources, with discussion of each as well as wider discussion of future directions for quantitative social work research in the UK. 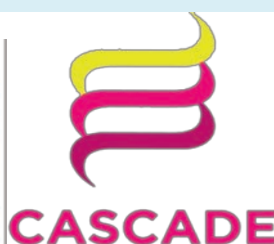
